#### 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed

This year, 2025, marks the 1700th anniversary of the Creed that we recite every Sunday.


The Council of Nicaea was convened in 325 in response to the growing heresy of Arianism that asserted that Jesus was the highest of all created beings, but not divine and not one in being with God.



The Council of Nicaea (325) expanded the second article of the creed to defend the full divinity of the Son.

"The first ecumenical council of Nicaea in 325 confessed in its Creed that the Son of God is 'begotten, not made, consubstantial (homoousios) with the Father,' and condemned Arius, who had affirmed that the Son of God 'came to be from things that were not' and that he was 'from another substance' than that of the Father." CCC465
