Nigeria - the stories we didn't hear on the nightly news

Scarcely a week goes by without kidnappings and killings of Christians in Nigeria, yet 94% of Nigerian Catholics attend Sunday Mass every week,

"What they (the Islamist militants) want is to be sure that Islam [takes] over every part of these places....And so



they're doing everything to make sure that Christianity is brought down and Islam is [the] established No. 1." (Bishop Wilfred Anagbe)

Stories like these are common:

Despite having been at the point of death after a bloody massacre, Father Ukuma Jonathan Angbianbee will stay with his people."I am here...and here is where I will stay and here I will continue serving people for the glory of God." ACI Prensa

In June, a Nigerian-born priest who had returned to Nigeria after serving in the Diocese of Fairbanks, Alaska for more than five years, was captured by the Muslim terrorist group Boko Haram. He is still being held captive. Catholic News Agency
