God Gives Himself to us, again and again

"From the first day of her existence, and then for centuries, the Church has celebrated Mass, from Sunday to Sunday, in memory of what the Lord did for her. In the hands of the priest and at his words: 'This is my Body, this is my Blood,' Jesus still gives his life on the altar. He still sheds his blood for us today...The Christian does not go to Mass out of duty, but because he needs it—absolutely—we need the life of God who gives himself without awaiting return!"

Pope Leo's first canonizations Sunday, September 7

Born in 1991 and raised in Milan, Blessed Acutis used his tech skills to evangelize and to spread devotion to the Eucharist. He was noted for his joyful faith and compassion for others. He died of leukemia in 2006 at age 15.



Blessed Frassati, born in 1901 into a prominent family in Turin, Italy, was admired for his deep spirituality, love for the poor and enthusiasm for life. A member of the Dominican Third Order, he served the sick through the St. Vincent de Paul Society. He died at age 24 after contracting polio, possibly from one of the people he assisted.
