

<u>Update on kidnapped Nigerian children</u>

Ninety-nine students and one teacher from the group of 265 who were abducted from a Catholic school in Nigeria on November 21 have been released. The top priority of local church is to secure the return of the remaining 165 students and teachers still being held. Aid to the Church in Need
