St Thomas Aquinas on the Feast of Corpus Christi



Since it was the will of God's only-begotten Son that men should share in his divinity, he assumed our nature in order that by becoming man he might make men gods. Moreover, when he took our flesh he dedicated the whole of its substance to our salvation. He offered his body to God the Father on the altar of the cross as a sacrifice for our reconciliation. He shed his blood for our ransom and purification, so that we might be redeemed from our wretched state of bondage and cleansed from all sin. But to ensure that the memory of so great a gift would abide with us for ever, he left his body as food and his blood as drink for the faithful to consume in the form of bread and wine.

Corpus Christi Mexico City procession cancelled

The Corpus Christi procession in Mexico City that would have marked its 500th year was cancelled this year due to demonstrations and road blocks put up by the striking teachers' union. The Archbishop Primate of Mexico, Cardinal Carlos Aguiar, cited concerns for the respect due the Sacrament and the safety of the participants. Consecration of United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

On Thursday, June 11, 2026, as part of the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. bishops will consecrate the United States of America to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.



Pope Leo XII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart in 1899. Before that and since, several countries have been consecrated to the Sacred Heart:

Ireland, Ecuador, Poland, Colombia, Kenya, Portugal, Spain, and Mexico. Mexico was first consecrated in 1874; the consecration was renewed in 2024. [National Catholic Register](#); [EWTN News](#)
